## RE: Vote NO on H.R. 3898, PERMIT Act – a reversal on bipartisan clean water safeguards impacting water-dependent businesses

Dear Speaker Johnson, Minority Leader Jeffries, and Members of the House of Representatives:

On behalf of the American Sustainable Business Network (ASBN) and our allies, we respectfully urge you to **vote NO on H.R. 3898**, the *Promoting Efficient Review for Modern Infrastructure Today Act* (PERMIT Act). While the bill is framed as a step toward streamlining infrastructure development, in reality, it undermines longstanding, bipartisan clean water protections that are critical to the health of our economy, communities, and environment.

Economic development and job creation must not come at the expense of clean water. Many of our member businesses are water-dependent and rely on stable, predictable environmental regulations to operate efficiently, meet consumer expectations, and maintain long-term profitability. Weakening the Clean Water Act through this legislation would introduce avoidable risks, increase operational costs, and undercut the integrity and resilience of entire industries.

We are particularly concerned that H.R. 3898:

- Undermines pollution controls critical to the Clean Water Act;
- Rewards polluters and incentivizes the degradation of wetlands, rivers, lakes, and streams;
- Creates financial uncertainty and reputational risks for sustainable businesses;
- Threatens market expansion opportunities tied to environmental performance.

Clean water is good for business. Numerous studies show that consumers favor companies that engage in water stewardship—associating it with environmental responsibility and positive social impact. Today, our investors, executives, and stakeholders are increasingly prioritizing water efficiency, ecosystem protection, and sustainable product design as part of long-term value creation strategies.

We therefore **oppose H.R. 3898 as currently written**, and we strongly urge Congress to pursue a bipartisan legislative package that both supports economic growth and safeguards our nation's precious water resources. Sustainable businesses depend on policies that balance progress with environmental responsibility—not trade one for the other.
